Keeping Contact Information Current, Safeguarding Information

OUMC relies on current contact information and changes for each household to effectively communicate and share ministry highlights. Please contact the church office when you have an address, email, phone number change. Also consider giving your alternate address when you go for extended stays in secondary homes. We appreciate your communication about changes so we can remain connected with you.

OUMC continues to monitor scam attempts and report to the congregation ways pastor, staff or emergency stories are used to try to scam you. Please understand a staff phone call to verify information received by email is a safeguard we use. Know that the pastor or staff will NEVER ask you to provide financial resources (money, gift cards, rides) to get them out of an emergency situation or to support ministry needs. If you get suspicious requests, do not open or reply to them and report them to the church office so that we can take appropriate measures. One of the best ways to detect if something is a scam attempt, look at the originator email. If it does not include onalaskaumc.org in it, then you are probably receiving a scam.






Our first class will be held on September 15th.



Background Information: Early Response Teams respond early after a disaster to provide compassionate care and work to prevent further damage to people and property in communities that request their assistance. The Virginia Conference has a great <u>video about ERTs here</u>.



VIRTUAL PARTY

The generosity of the congregation to meet the mission of OUMC to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world is celebrated. In the past two months, over \$4500 was raised at the Chicken Q to support Mission Guatemala; over \$700 was raised at the Car Wash to support the YouthWorks mission trip to Colorado; numerous toiletry items and VBS supplies continue to flow through the door; HOURS have been labored in the beautification of the church campus and organization of the interior church building; many people have worked faithfully to update the 4th Ave rental property inside and out as well as addressing long overdue projects at the Locust St rental property. In addition to all of this, countless acts of generosity flow from the doors of OUMC into the local community, state, and world. OUMC is blessed to be a blessing.

We are facing the tension between being a debt free church and the need to replace the church roof over the sanctuary. The total project cost could be as high as \$150,000 with bids coming in at approximately \$110,000 and \$40,000 contingency funds to address any unknowns that come up when the current roof comes off. It is a big expense and undertaking. However, it is a necessary project to protect all that is contained under the roof, including the worship space, instruments, and technology.

Your household has probably already received the invitation to give toward the roof replacement project with gifts up front and/or a pledge over two years. Please prayerfully consider contributing so that we go into this project with as little debt as possible.

Trustees Message

A particularly strong storm in the past month took facia off the roof line on the Locust Street side of the church building. Contractors were called to address the problem but uncovered issues with the roof over the sanctuary.

Upon further evaluation, the roof was determined to need replacement. Bids for the work were secured, conversation and approvals within our committee structure (Trustees, Finance, Church Council) were decided. Onalaska United Methodist Church approved allocating up to \$150,000 for the roof replacement project. Bids are in the range of \$110,000 to not only address shingle replacement, but adding insulation which will assist in long term energy cost savings. There still may be unknown issues when the roof is replaced so the added cushion in the approved funds is to address this possibility.

The proposed project timeline is:

August 12 - Project starts (date accommodates ministry activities the first week of August) August 30 - Most work substantially complete

September - Address miscellaneous items

Every effort for safety will be made for those on the property when work is being done. There may be building access impacts which will be communicated through the weekly communication tools. Your prayerful and financial support for the roof replacement project is appreciated. A study led by the Lily Family School of Philanthropy finds that empathy is increasing among young Americans since 2008, almost rising to levels similar to the highs of the 1970s. Late Millennials and emerging Gen Zs are showing increases in empathy, as compared with earlier generations, countering negative stereotypes about today's youth. This study, which is an updating of a similar study conducted in 2011, underscores that empathy is not predetermined; it is a fluid trait that can grow or shrink, depending on one's experiences. Here are some key findings from the study:

• Changes in empathy over time in young Americans move in cycles and can go up and down. Both taking (cognitive empathy) and empathic concern (emotional empathy) increased between 2008 and 2018.

• Economic variables don't play a major role in empathy changes in U.S. youth—either to promote or impair empathy.

• Changing interpersonal dynamics might play a larger role in these empathy fluctuations. Empathy was higher during times of loneliness. The studies author noted that when young people see loneliness and other difficulties around them, they may reach out with care and empathy. It's also possible that their own experiences of loneliness may increase their hunger for social connection.


